**tmux Cheat-Sheet**

Meta key combo is used for triggering commands. By default, meta key combo is set to Ctrl + b. This is configurable in `~/ .tmux.conf`. In this document, your default key combo is listed like this: Cm-C.

## Attaching / Detaching / Re-attaching

Syntax	Description
<code>tmux new -s &lt;session_name&gt;</code>	Creates a new session with the specified name.
<code>tmux ls</code>	Lists currently attached sessions.
<code>tmux a</code>	Attach to the last session.
<code>tmux a -t &lt;session_name&gt;</code>	Re-attach to the specific session.

## General keyboard shortcuts

Syntax	Description
Cm-C 0	Moves to the first window.
Cm-C 1	Moves to the second window.
Cm-C d	Detaches tmux and returns to your regular terminal.
Cm-C \$	Renames current session.

## Navigating between windows

Syntax	Description
Cm-C c	Creates a new window.
Cm-C n	Moves to the next window.
Cm-C w	Lists all windows.
Cm-C ,	Renames a window.
Cm-C f	Find a window.
Cm-C &	Kill the window.

## Navigating panes

### Syntax

Cm-C %

Cm-C “

Cm-C <arrow\_key>

Cm-C o

Cm-C ;

Cm-C x

Cm-C q

Cm-C t

### Description

Splits the current pane horizontally.

Splits the current pane vertically.

Move between panes using arrow keys.

Moves to the next pane.

Moves to the previous pane.

Kills the current pane.

Displays pane numbers.

Displays current time.
