Attaching / Detaching / Re-attaching

Syntax	Description
tmux new -s <session_name></session_name>	Creates a new session with the specified name.
tmux ls	Lists currently attached sessions.
tmux a	Attach to the last session.
tmux a -t <session_name></session_name>	Re-attach to the specific session.

General keyboard shortcuts

Syntax	Description
Cm-C 0	Moves to the first window.
Cm-C 1	Moves to the second window.
Cm-C d	Detaches tmux and returns to your regular terminal.
Cm-C \$	Renames current session.

Navigating between windows

Syntax	Description
Cm-C c	Creates a new window.
Cm-C n	Moves to the next window.
Cm-C w	Lists all windows.
Cm-C ,	Renames a window.
Cm-C f	Find a window.
Cm-C &	Kill the window.

Navigating panes

Syntax Description

Cm-C % Splits the current pane horizontally.

Cm-C " Splits the current pane vertically.

Cm-C <arrow_key> Move between panes using arrow keys.

Cm-C o Moves to the next pane.

Cm-C; Moves to the previous pane.

Cm-C x Kills the current pane.

Cm-C q Displays pane numbers.

Cm-C t Displays current time.
